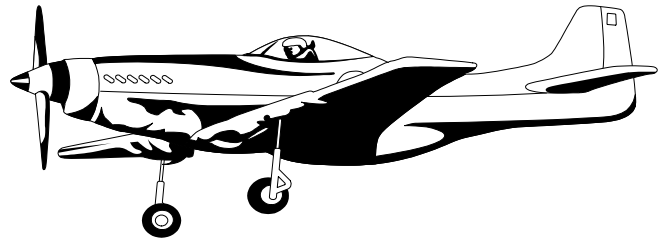

Minutes of the January 11, 2007 Meeting

New Business
