Blast from the Past By David J. Price


This series of articles will present advertisements from vintage modeling magazines. The intent is to illustrate technological advances that have taken place in our hobby. For some it will bring back memories, for newcomers it will present a piece of history of radio control model aviation.



Here is an advertisement from the August 1942 issue of Model Airplane News for Testors Model Airplane cement and Butyrate Dope. Testor Corporation is still a large American manufacturer of model kits, tools, and accessories based in Rockford, Illinois.

According to Testors web page (https://www.testors.com/pages/about-testors/our-history/):

The company started back in 1929, when Nils Testor, a voung Swedish immigrant, purchased the assets of a small Rockford company making product called "Karlson's adhesive Klister." Klister was an adhesive made for mending women's stockings, and chiefly used by local cobblers for making and repairing shoes. As the glue became more applications popular other were developed. The young company eventually fell on hard times. Axel Karlson, the founder, sold his interest in the firm and returned to Sweden. Nils Testor recognized the need for this kind of adhesive and stepped in and took over what was soon to become the Testor Chemical Company. Hobbvist model cement and butyrate dope were introduced to the public in 1936.

Location - The Lexington Model Airplane Club Field. 4200 Hedger Lane, Lexington KY. Via I-64 take exit 87 and follow the signs. You can travel interstate highways to within a couple miles of our field.

If you would like to come to a laid back fly-in without too many rules, the Kentucky Fall Classic may be your event. We offer hospitality and fun. One of the best home cooked dinners you will ever get at a fly-in or restaurant. We have lots of hotels, restaurants and other entertainment all within a few minutes of our field.

This is technically a Giant Scale Event but we will allow open flying on Thursday and Sunday. Giant scale specs apply on non-open flying days with some exceptions. Mono plane = 80 inch or larger wingspan, Bi-plane = 60 inch or greater wingspan. Warbirds with 70 inch wingspan or greater. Any size turbine jets.

Landingfee is by donation. Camper hookup is \$10 per night.

We hope to have some funthings planned for the open flying days. Hint-Bring your electric planes and practice your spot landings.

A Saturday night dinner for pilots and their guests will be available. Tickets will be \$12.00 per plate.

The field features a 650 foot paved runway and a parallel grass runway. The flying area is open and unrestricted. Onsite camping is permitted. We have 8 - 30 amp hookups. They are first come first served reservations will not be accepted.
