 - b. Approved by the membership








Blast from the Past By David J. Price

Here is the cover from the December 1971 of Model Builder. How many RC items do you recognize? Merry Christmas! Hope Santa brings you lots of modeling goodies.




21st LMAC Swap Meet Results from David Price, committee chair
