Guest Pilots: A guest flyer must have AMA card. Per the Bylaws, any club member may host a guest at the flying field three (3) times per year. A person living within a 50 mile radius can fly as a hosted guest three (3) times in their life time. Sanctioned flying meets are excluded. At next meeting, a ruling on exceptions is needed for guest pilots flying at the club airfield.

Club meeting date and location change options were presented by Gayle Moore. At the next meeting, members should be prepared to discuss having every other club meeting on the first Saturday of the month starting on May 6, 2017. These Saturday club meetings at the airfield should include a noontime cook-out. The last Morning Pointe club meeting will be April 13, 2017.

IRS Non-Profit Conflict of Interest Form for 2017 was signed by club officers and to be included with club tax records.

Club-owned website and email system information was given to club president and a few others by Bob Cooper, webmaster for backup purposes.

Airfield Gate Lock

We have installed a new chain with shortened links on the air field gate to control where the locks can be placed.

The airfield gage lock has been an ongoing problem in which one or more locks are been bypassed which locks out a number people. Any one of three locks must be able to open the gate. Hopefully, these shorten chain segments will prevent confusion.

Notice, the two locks labeled “2016” and “2017”. As of Jan 1, 2017, everyone needs to renew club membership and turn in last year’s key to get a 2017 gate key. The 2016 lock will be removed on April 1, 2017. Flying in 2017 is not permitted, if club membership and/ AMA membership has expired.

Something new for 2017, the club has voted to provide an AMA Card holder to be worn on your person at airfield. Displaying your AMA card will help everyone to get to know you, as well as help ensure that only current members are utilizing the airfield per LFUCG and LMAC requirements.

When dues are paid, you will receive the AMA card holder with your 2017 club membership sticker. Affix club sticker to AMA card. Insert your AMA card in the badge holder and clip it on your shirt, etc. Pickup a shirt clip for your AMA card holder in the first aid box at the airfield shelter. You are welcome to use your own method of displaying your AMA card as long as your name, club sticker and AMA expiration date are visible on your person while at the airfield.

The airfield gate will remain open if members are present. When last person leaves – lock the gate. If you have the old 2016 airfield gate key, you will need to return it to me. I will exchange it for the 2017 gate key. If you did not have a key and want one, then send a \$5.00 refundable deposit to me and I will send you a 2017 key. Your old key and/or money can be given to me at a club meeting or at the airfield. The old airfield lock to be removed April 1, 2017.

Remember, it is time to renew your club membership for 2017. Obtain your 2017 membership renewal form on the LMAC website ([click here](#)), fill out the form, attach a check, old key and mail to me. I will mail you a new key if requested and club sticker.

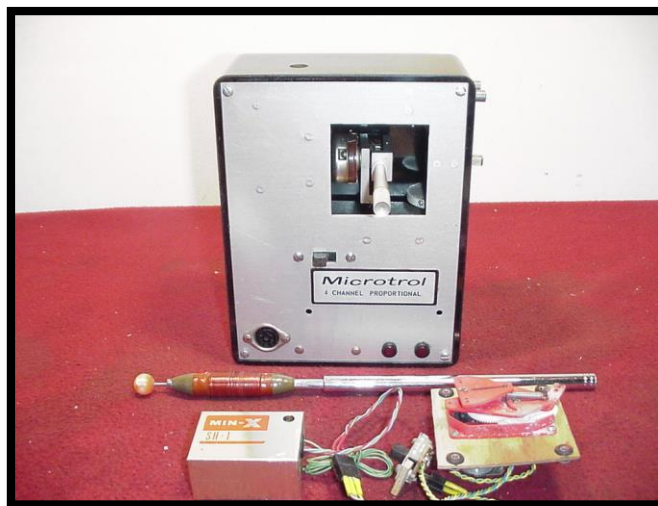
