Here is an advertisement from the June 1959 issue of Model Airplane News for Comet's C/L models and racing car. The planes look cool, but I bet they were difficult to fly. The planes came with an "OK" Cub .049 engine.

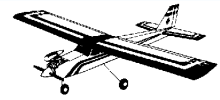
