Blast from the Past

This series of articles will present advertisements from vintage modeling magazines. The intent is to illustrate technological advances that have taken place in our hobby. For some it will bring back memories, for newcomers it will present a piece of history of radio control model aviation.

Here is an advertisement from the June 1933 issue of Universal Model Airplane News for Aero Model Builders Guild "Zip Tools". Items advertised included: balsa shaper, handy sander, Zip-stripper, and Zip-nife. I particularly like the Zip-stripper for 50 cents, it almost looks like a section of railroad rail. The stripper is an earlier version of the Masters Airscrew balsa stripper (which I find very useful). You have to love the Zip-nife for 10 cents plus 2 cents for postage. I had to include the magazine cover, showing an unfortunate pilot bailing out of the Gee Bee.

Location - The Lexington Model Airplane Club Field. 4200 Hedger Lane, Lexington KY. Via I-64 take exit 87 and follow the signs. You can travel interstate highways to within a couple miles of our field.

If you would like to come to a laid back fly-in without too many rules, the Kentucky Fall Classic may be your event. We offer hospitality and fun. One of the best home cooked dinners you will ever get at a fly-in or restaurant. We have lots of hotels, restaurants and other entertainment all within a few minutes of our field.

This is technically a Giant Scale Event but we will allow open flying on Thursday and Sunday. Giant scale specs apply on non-open flying days with some exceptions. Mono plane = 80 inch or larger wingspan, Bi-plane = 60 inch or greater wingspan. Warbirds with 70 inch wingspan or greater. Any size turbine jets.

Landing fee is by donation. Camper hookup is \$10 per night.

We hope to have some fun things planned for the open flying days. Hint - Bring your electric planes and practice your spot landings.

A Saturday night dinner for pilots and their guests will be available. Tickets will be \$12.00 per plate.

The field features a 650 foot paved runway and a parallel grass runway. The flying area is open and unrestricted. Onsite camping is permitted. We have 8 - 30 amp hookups. They are first come first served reservations will not be accepted.
