Minutes of May 11, 2019 Meeting

Minutes from the May club meeting which was held Saturday May 11 @ 11:00 a.m. at the LMAC field:

Mickey called the meeting to order at 11:15 a.m.

The minutes from the April meeting were approved.

Treasurers report:

We have spent all of the money in the runway fund. The runway refurbishment cost \$6,200. The club has \$12,125.27 after the runway payment. A half dozen new members have recently joined the club. We are on track to have approximately 110 members. The treasurers' report was approved.

Curtis Adams suggested sealing runway cracks once a year. Might want to contribute \$1250 or more, annually, to a runway fund.

Discussed painting an "X" on both ends of the runway. There wasn't much interest in doing this but Paul Bail might use the remaining runway paint to paint "X"s on both ends of the runway.

Discussed the upcoming Vintage Fly-In and the allowable vintage airplanes.

Dave Price said he will set up a day to meet for landfill plane retrieval instruction.

The volunteers for landfill plane retrieval are: Mickey Breunig, Paul Bail, Carroll Ware, Lester Ware, Sylvester Hale, Marty Weinstock, Mike Lambert, Jeff Cummings.

Discussed the club's LT-40 trainer. We want to make it electric but buying an electric motor, ESC, batteries, etc. can be more expensive than simply buying a foam trainer. Marty offered to provide an Apprentice trainer free of charge. We voted to accept Marty's offer.

Discussed the gravel for the parking lot and Curtis Adams mentioned improving the ground for the right-most carport shelter. Curtis will look into leveling the ground and placing Astro Turf on the ground under the right-most shelter.

The refrigerator blew over a couple of months ago. We discussed immobilizing the fridge so it doesn't blow over.

The meeting adjourned at 12:04 then Mickey fired up the grill and we ate burgers, hot dogs, chips, cookies.

Plane of the month: Sylvester Hale and Buddy Hale won plane of the month with an Extreme Flight Extra 300. It's an electric plane which is powered by a 6S Lipo battery. Buddy demo'ed the plane ... it goes straight up with power to spare!

Here is an advertisement from the July 1941 issue of AeroModeller, for Fluxite. Basically, a "flux gun" to deliver the flux to the part you are going to solder. I like the sentence about cyclist keeping their wheels round.

While I have been a member of LMAC since around 1965 or so, I do not participate any more in control line except occasionally to coach Kenny Stevens.

Soon I will have a book published titled "Stunt History - The Story of Model Aircraft Control Line Precision Aerobatics 1937 - 2014." This is a detailed history of control line "stunt" starting with the first flights in 1937, and concentrating on competition from the first time stunt was the the U.S. Nationals in 1946 to 2014. The book is a year by year compilation of the events as stunt airplanes evolved, engines, new building techniques, reviews of many airplanes that were both flown in competition and were featured in the magazines, and many "bios" of fliers.

The work will be a two volume set comprised of 960 pages with 1550 photographs.

As I have finished my research (starting in 1976 for the project) I have around 2,013 model airplane magazines that I would like to pass on to anyone interested. This includes Model Airplane News, Air Trails and its descendants (American Aircraft Modeler and then Model Aviation), and Flying Models from the early 1940s to the 2000s. All any interested person has to do is come by my house in Lexington and load up the magazines.

They are in binders or jackets by each year. Call me at 859-271-3394 for more information. They are FREE.

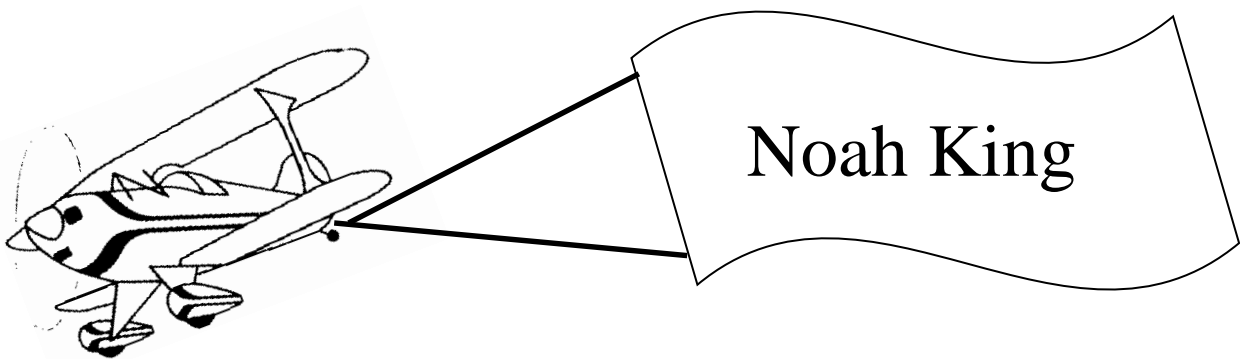
