Here is an advertisement from the July 1950 issue of Model Airplane News for the Dooling .29 engine and props. It is hard to read, but the engine was \$14.95 and the props were \$0.50. How many of you remember these "novelty" ads? Kids could order an engine, a spy camera, and an air pistol.

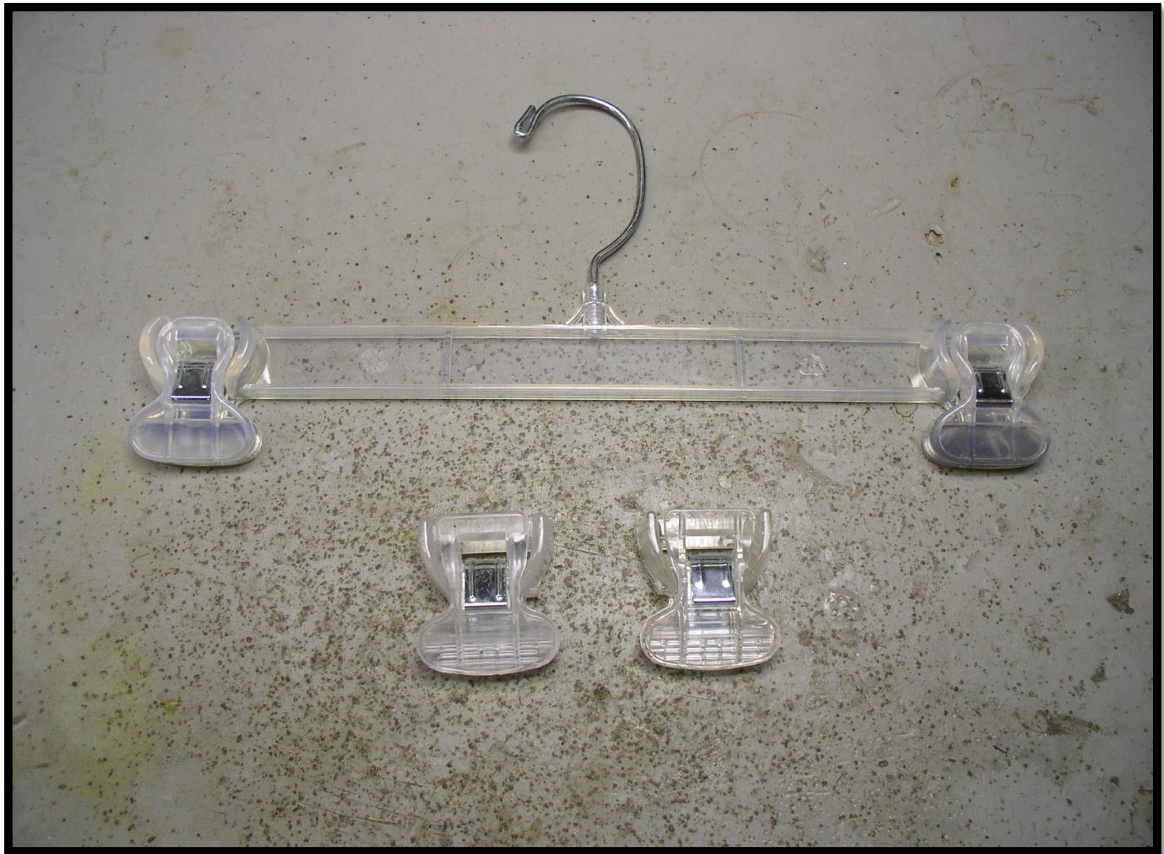
Builder's Corner - Cheap Glue Clamps

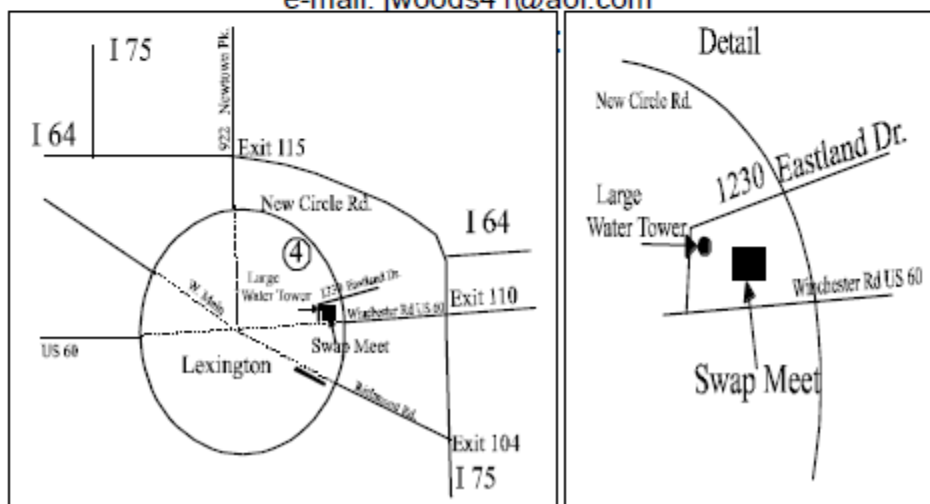
