

Blast from the Past



This series of articles will present advertisements from vintage modeling magazines. The intent is to illustrate technological advances that have taken place in our hobby. For some, it will bring back memories, for newcomers it will present a piece of history of radio control model aviation.

Here is an advertisement from the April 1948 issue of Model Airplane News for the Stanzel Bee-Line Jets. Not an RC or CL, more of a tethered aircraft. More information on Stanzel company can be found at: http://www.stanzelmuseum.org/history.html

According to the web site:

1948 The Stanzel company introduces the "Bee Line" series of model jet airplanes which are flown along a 100- to 400-foot long steel wire and propelled by CO2 gas cartridges.

Branching out into another sort of model in 1947 the Stanzel firm, unveiled several flown via what they called "Bee-Line." These miniatures had fuselages just large enough to hold a standard CO2 cartridge; they were "flown" on a fine steel wire strung tight between two supports. At first a 400' length of music wire was supplied with these kits, but customers got all tangled trying to unroll this wire, which was .012 dia., so the length was cut to 100'. Since the models traveled along the wire at speeds well over 100 mph it was standard practice to put some soft pillows at the far end to bring them safely to a stop. These models were in production until 1950.


Please join your LMAC members to re-set the tables at 1:00 PM. The club officers are usually the core group that re-sets the tables. Come out and give them a hand.




