






Trainer Banger 2019 Results

Discussion was had regarding a future Mall type of show.

Due to the lack of LMAC officer positions being nominated, the meeting was not closed and will continue next month.

2019 Swap Meet Report by Joe Woods

First, I want to thank everyone who helped with this year's Swap Meet. We had a great turnout for the table setup at 7:00 AM and a better than normal turnout to reset the tables at around 1:00 PM. The Club Officers were there in force for the reset and probably 5 more club members where part of the crew. The buyer's table was managed by Mike Higgins, Mike Lambert, and Lee Wright. Bill Althauser had the table behind the Buyer's table and gave the group "guidance" and relief so that they could get around to check the bargains. Again, Lester Ware ran the LMAC tables to sell the donated items. Carroll Ware arranged a deal to help a couple who were liquidating a number of good pieces from a family member's passing. That helped the club table by about \$290.


We sold all of the 70 tables plus 4 tables of floor space and 6 of the 8 smaller computer tables for a total of 80. Last year we sold 79 tables and spaces. Donations were down \$190 from last year's record; but were \$446 above the 10 year average. So, the club tables produced a very nice amount of the total profit. Again, we see the importance of the donations by our members. I saw a number of members bringing items to the club table. Buyer's fees were up by \$41 and the number of buyers was up 15%. The raffle item produced a pure profit of \$181 because the Futaba transmitter/receiver was donated by one of the Fall Classic raffle winners. Thanks to Curtis Adams for that arrangement. The raffle profit was up \$39 over last year. The expenses were the same as last year. The overall contribution to the club was \$1485; which is second highest over the last 10 years.

I had a number of participants complement us on the quality of our Swap Meet and say that they will be back. We again did the Door Prize giveaway and that was fun. Hopefully, the Door Prize activity holds a few people a little longer. We had a number of seller's come in from Tennessee and a few from Ohio. I send notices to all of the clubs in Kentucky and in the surrounding states. In all, e-mail notices were sent to 331 clubs. Those notices help; but I think the primary advertising is through the AMA's Model Aviation magazine.

I welcome any suggestions as to how we could have a better Swap Meet. Any ideas on how to get more buyers to attend would be helpful. Hopefully, our members enjoyed the opportunity to interact with both our members and out of town swappers, and possibly pickup some bargains. The Swap Meet continues to generate about \$1500 for the club.
