Our 2022 LMAC Swap Meet is coming up on November 12, 2022, 9AM to 1PM. The Swap Meet has been sanctioned with AMA (Sanction Event Number: 13667). The meet will be held in the West Jessamine High School. The address is West Jessamine High School, 2101 Wilmore Rd., Nicholasville, KY 40356. That is on Hwy 29 between US 27 Bypass and US 68. 




Blast from the Past By David J. Price

This series of articles will present advertisements from vintage modeling magazines. The intent is to illustrate technological advances that have taken place in our hobby. For some it will bring back memories, for newcomers it will present a piece of history of radio control model aviation.

Here is an advertisement from the February 1955 issue of Model Airplane News for the Turb-O-Prop from The Dempster Company. It is a gas turbine propeller that uses "Jet-Tex" fuel. Jetex motors, fuel, and accessories were imported from England and distributed in the U.S. by Aristo-Craft Distinctive Miniatures. The advertisement claims that it was the first practical replacement for rubber

band power. Never seen one in operation, but I believe it might be impressive to see it spin around, although the run would be short timed.

Remote ID Deadlines Draw Near

- FAA
- FRIA
- Remote ID

As most of you know, the FAA's <u>Final Rule for Remote ID</u> of Unmanned Aircraft was released on December 28, 2020, and published on January 15, 2021. In that rule, the FAA outlined three ways that UAS operators can comply with the upcoming Remote ID requirement:

Standard Remote ID

- 1) Identify both the UAS and control station
- Broadcast equipment will be built into UAS at the manufacturers' level, but likely will not apply to ARFs or kits.
- Requires radio frequency spectrum to broadcast location, altitude, ID, emergency status, etc., for both UAS and control station.
 - UAS designed not to take off if not broadcasting a signal.

Broadcast Modules

- 2) Identify line-of-sight UAS operations
 - Module option allows for older (nonstandard) UAS.
- Sends same signal as standard, except no emergency status and no control station information.
- The information broadcast will be UAS take-off location and altitude. Module also needs to signal if not working properly.
 - FAA anticipates modules to cost approximately \$50 (pre-inflation estimate).

FAA-Recognized Identification Areas (FRIA)

- 3) Identify Community-Based Organization (CBO) locations with line-of-sight UAS operations
- No standard Remote ID or Broadcast Module required when flying at an FAA-approved FRIA.
 - Valid for 48 months and renewal/changeable forever.
 - Requires that the site be under the umbrella of a CBO or educational institute.



Remote ID (cont'd)

The FAA Final Rule stated that the FRIA application process and manufacturer requirement to implement standard Remote ID will begin September 16, 2022. However, at the time this article was written, the FAA has yet to publish AC 91-57C, which establishes a process to recognize CBOs.

Because CBO status is a requirement to apply for FRIA status, it is likely that the FAA will miss this September deadline. Please keep in mind that UAS operators have until September 16, 2023, before Remote ID compliance is required, and that date could be extended if the agency fails to meet current and future deadlines.

AMA plans to do as much of the legwork as possible for our clubs during the FRIA application process. Although we don't fully know what the application process will consist of, AMA is hopeful that we can make all FRIA requests on behalf of our clubs.

When this process begins, we will contact all clubs to verify their flying site operating area and verify all other related information. We appreciate your patience once the process begins and we start applying for FRIA status for our 2,400 club flying sites.


The AMA has now been approved to administer The Recreational UAS Safety Test, or TRUST. AMA has worked closely with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), ensuring that TRUST meets the intent of Congress without placing an undue burden on our hobby community.

Since 1936, the AMA has been dedicated to the hobby of model aviation, to educational programming, and safety in the airspace. We are offering the TRUST to the entire community of model aviation enthusiasts free of charge.

Make sure you are using the latest version of your browser (ex. Chrome, Firefox, Safari) to ensure the test runs as smoothly as possible.

On February 22, 2021, the FAA released information regarding the next step of implementation of the Recreational Knowledge and Safety Test. This step includes the application process for organizations interested in serving as test administrators for The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST). See below for FAQs regarding the test:





Have you taken your TRUST Exam Yet..

Q: What is "TRUST"?

A: "TRUST" stands for The Recreational UAS Safety Test

Q: Why do I need to take TRUST?

A: The Knowledge and Safety Test is a congressional mandate in the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018. **All UAS users** must pass the test in order to operate a recreational model aircraft (UAS) within the National Airspace System (NAS).

Q: I have a Part 107 Certificate; do I also need to complete TRUST?

A: Part 107 does not dictate why you fly, whether for only business, fun or any other reason; you must only adhere to the Part 107 rule. However, if you wish to fly under the Exception for Limited Recreational Operations of Unmanned Aircraft rule (PL 115-254 Sec. 349/USC 44809), then you must take the TRUST.

Q: Are youth under the age of 18 required to complete TRUST?

A: Yes. There are no exemptions from taking the test, including for minors. Youth can get assistance from an adult, if needed.

Q: How often do I need to take the test?

A: At this time, recreational flyers only need to take the test once to comply.

Q: What will be on TRUST?

A: The test has 23 multiple-choice questions about basic safety guidelines and recreational flying knowledge that most AMA members likely already know. The test is fail-proof and every recreational user will be able to complete and pass the test.

Q: Does TRUST cost anything?

A: No. Test administrators are prohibited from charging a fee, either directly or indirectly, to individuals taking the test.

Q: How will I know that I have passed TRUST and am able to fly my UAS?

A: Once you complete and pass the test, your test administrator will provide you with a TRUST completion certificate that you can either print or save electronically. This certificate is proof of your compliance with the Reauthorization Act of 2018 and your passage of the test.

Q: Will TRUST affect my AMA membership benefits?

A: Proof of test completion will not be a requirement for AMA membership. However, each member affirms that they will follow AMA's safety code, including applicable laws and regulations, when he or she signs up to be a member.

Q: When will recreational users be required to take the test?

A: Recreational Flyers are encouraged to take the test as soon as practicable.

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
