Blast from the Past



New Pulse Transmitter Overview

Back in the 1960's radio control was still in its infancy. A lot of pilots used 1, 2 and three channel pulse proportional transmitters. These transmitters were made by such manufacturers as Controlaire, World Engine, Minx, Airtrol and ACE. Of course there were many others as this list is not inclusive.

Many different brands of receivers were used as well as super regenerative and super heterodyne models. Most of these were on the 27 MHz citizens band.

Many of the pilots that grew up in the 60's with this type of equipment would like to revert to that day but with the reliability of today's transmission methods.

The purpose of this conversion is to give new life to the old format transmitters with today's reliability. This conversion used an old Futaba FP-T3S but most any carcass could be used. Only the case and stick assembly are used from the old transmitter.

Since there are many variables depending on the old transmitter case chosen, this is not a detailed kit build. The manuals are how I did mine.

This transmitter uses a microprocessor encoder to emulate old technology for generating a signal that varies in frequency, pulse width and pulse rate.

A 4K Microchip processor was used as the encoder and this complete computer is in a 14 pin module which contains a 10 bit analog to digital converter.

This chip has a built in timers that can be used in many ways. Timer 1 used to generate the audio tone that is transmitted. The software checks the stick pots and turns this tone on or off to generate the pulse that is relayed to the receiver.

This encoder allows 9 different plane programs and each one can be named. The pulse rate, width and tone frequency can be different for each plane. It can accommodate Galloping Ghost as well as high rate pulse. Two audio tones are allowed at 800 and 1200 Hz. Number 9 is a special push button single channel operation. See the operators manual for a explanation.

The RF section of the transmitter is the ACE AM deck from Silver 7, MicroPro8000 or other ACE transmitters. I have one transmitter on 27 MHz and one on 53 MHz using these decks. Old Proline decks would probably work also since the RF portion is the same as the ACE deck.

What receivers can be used with this transmitter? Old receivers can be used with this transmitter since it transmits exactly the same signal as the old transmitters that were made by Controlaire, Minx and others. However, more reliable receivers can be used.

Thanks to Jean-Marie Piednoir. His development of how to convert an AM digital receiver to decode a tone pulse width/rate system is much appreciated. More will be explained in the pulse receiver conversion manual about these receivers and how to convert them for this use.

The HP RF-2 on 27 MHz and ACE Pro810 on 53 MHz will be covered. For more information visit website

Future articles will include the receiver modifications, a new decoder and two modified throttle servos for pulse.


Picture 1 is the front view of the Futaba FP-T3S case with the addition of the throttle switches. The old throttle control slot was covered. For battery voltage the meter was retained.

Picture 2 is the top of the case showing the addition of the LCD and the programming push button. The original Futaba antenna was used.

Picture 3 shows the internals. In the upper left, the 3D printed LCD mount is shown in orange. To the right of center is the 3D printed encoder PCB tray in white. This PCB is the entire encoder with the PIC microprocessor. Under the black LCD connector is the ACE RF deck. The orange rectangle on the transmitter bottom is a 3S1P LIFE P04 battery of 1500 Ma.

The field features a 50 x 700 foot paved runway with a 50 x 700 foot grass running parallel to the pavement. A large overfly areas allows plenty of room for low passes and speed runs.

The field is located east of Lexington just off of I-64. From Lexington, take I-64 East to the Bluegrass Station exit (exit 87), proceed toward Bluegrass Station to Rockwell Road (1st road on the right), turn onto Rockwell Road and go about 1 mile to Hedger Lane. Go through the gates and follow this road for approximately 1 mile to the Lexington Model Airplane Facility


