The grass is mowed and is very suitable to walk to and fly. There are no exceptions. These are the only flying areas.

As AMA anticipated, the FAA has announced they are extending the Remote ID enforcement date by six months. Operators now have until March 16, 2024 before they will have to comply with the rule.
